Veolia Transportation Wins Napa Valley Contract Renewal

Contract Award is Five Years with Options

Napa Valley, CA – August 13, 2009 – Veolia Transportation has been awarded a five year contract renewal for Napa Valley's *The Vine* Fixed Route service and *VineGo* Paratransit service. The contract which was awarded by Napa County Transportation and Planning Agency (NCTPA) begins September 1, 2009, and has two one-year options.

The announcement was made this week by Northern California's Regional Vice President Ron Bushman. In making the announcement, Bushman said, "Winning this contract renewal is very exciting for everyone at Veolia Transportation. We've had a presence in Napa Valley operating transit for the last 17 years and greatly value our partnership with NCTPA. Looking ahead to the next five years, we plan to introduce some of the latest technology, like Wireless DriveCam, which will provide enhanced safety to both services."

Bushman said Veolia Transportation and NCTPA will also introduce technology to make the service more customer-friendly, including real time electronic messages, Google Transit and WiFi, which are all scheduled for the transit system beginning in early 2010.

In addition to Fixed Route and Paratransit services, the company also operates a deviated fixed route service, plus local circulators and express service.
